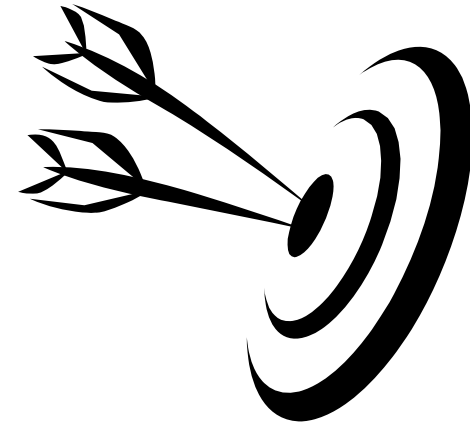

IBC Training: Who?



- IBC Members

- Institutional Review Board (IRB)
- Institutional Animal Care & Use Committee (IACUC)
- Business Managers
- University Administration



IBC Training: What?

- Tailor information to specific audience.
 - PI's responsibilities under the NIH Guidelines.
 - IRB and IACUC – how do NIH Guidelines apply to human and animal research?
 - Business Managers – often first in contact with new researchers/faculty.
 - Institutional responsibility to ensure the NIH Guidelines are followed.

IBC Training: How?

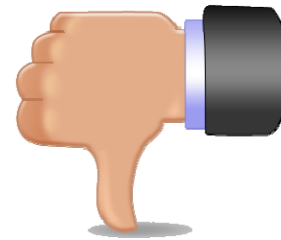


- Keep beating the drum!
 - “All institutions receiving NIH funds must comply with NIH Guidelines. Non-compliance could result in...
- Requirement for prior NIH approval of any or all rDNA projects at that institution.
- Suspension, limitation or **termination of NIH funds** at the institution.
